Join us in honoring and celebrating 156 years of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, recognizing our enduring commitment to community impact, service, and fostering a sense of belonging. The Elks foster a spirit of camaraderie and brotherhood among their members, who share a belief in God and a commitment to the principles of charity, justice, brotherly love, and fidelity. The Elks welcome men and women who are American citizens of any race, color, religion, or national origin, who are at least 21 years old and of good moral character, share a belief in God, honor our Country’s Flag, and support its Constitution. Founded in 1868 by a group of actors in New York City, the Elks have grown to become one of the largest and most active fraternal organizations in the United States, with nearly 800,000 members and 1,800 Lodges across the country. The Elks have a rich and colorful history, having witnessed and participated in many historical events, such as the Civil War, the World Wars, the Great Depression, the Civil Rights Movement, and the War on Terror. The Elks have many notable members, such as Presidents, Senators, Governors, Generals, astronauts, actors, singers, athletes, and more. In 1995, the Phoenix Lodge proudly initiated former Arizona State Governor Rose Mofford as one of the first women members of the Order.

The Elks are dedicated to serving their communities through various charitable programs, such as scholarships, veterans services, youth activities, drug awareness, and community investment. In the past year, the Elks donated more than \$399 million in cash, goods, and volunteer hours to various causes, making a significant impact on the lives of millions of people. Spicy Chipotle Chili Winning 1st Place

Ingredients:

- 28 oz canned diced tomatoes
- 6 oz can of tomato paste
- 15 oz can of tomato sauce
- 15 oz can of kidney beans, drained
- 15 oz can of pinto beans, drained
- 2-3 chipotle chilies in adobo sauce, diced (adjust to taste)
- 1-2 tablespoons of adobo sauce (adjust to taste)
- 1 large white onion, diced
- ½ large yellow onion, diced
- 1 green bell pepper, diced
- 1 lb ground beef

- 1 lb hot Italian sausage
 - 2 tablespoons chili powder
 - 2 tablespoons garlic (powder or minced)
 - 1 tablespoon paprika
 - 3 tablespoons cumin
 - Olive oil or avocado oil (as needed)

- Open all cans. Drain the kidney beans and pinto beans.

 - In a small bowl, mix together the chili powder, garlic, paprika, and cumin.
 - Cook Onions and Bell Pepper:
 - In a large pot, heat a splash of olive oil or avocado oil over medium heat.
 - Add the diced onions and bell pepper. Cook until they become aromatic and slightly softened.
 - Cook Meat and Spices:
 - Add the ground beef and hot Italian sausage to the pot. Cook until they are halfway done.
 - Add the spice mixture to the meat and continue cooking until the meat is fully browned.
 - Add Remaining Ingredients:
 - Stir in the diced tomatoes, tomato sauce, tomato paste, diced chipotle chilies, and adobo sauce.
 - Let the mixture simmer for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.
 - Final Steps:
 - Add the drained kidney beans and pinto beans to the pot.
 - Continue to cook on low heat, either in the pot or transfer to a crockpot, for at least one hour, stirring occasionally. The longer it cooks, the better the flavor develops.
 - Serve hot and enjoy your spicy chipotle chili!

Kids Movie Night: "Home"

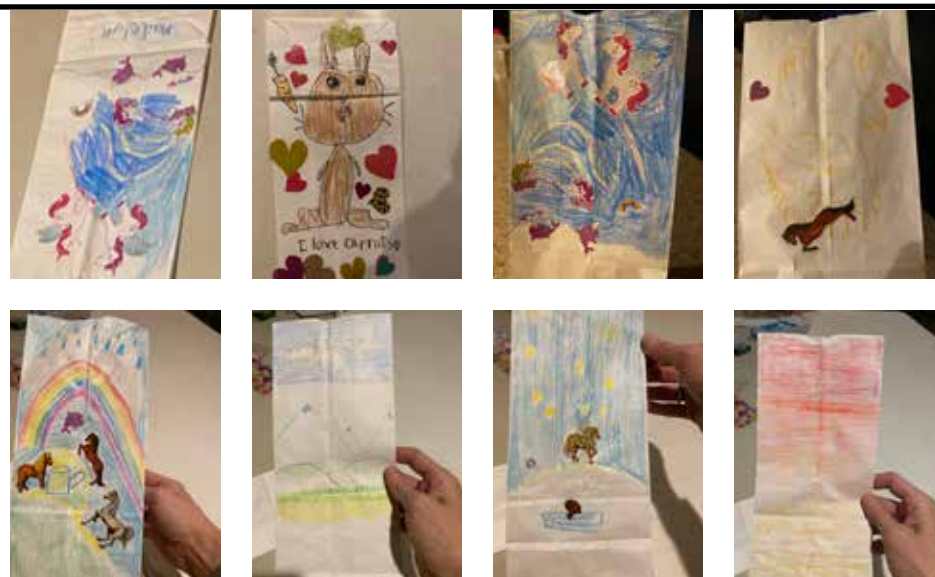

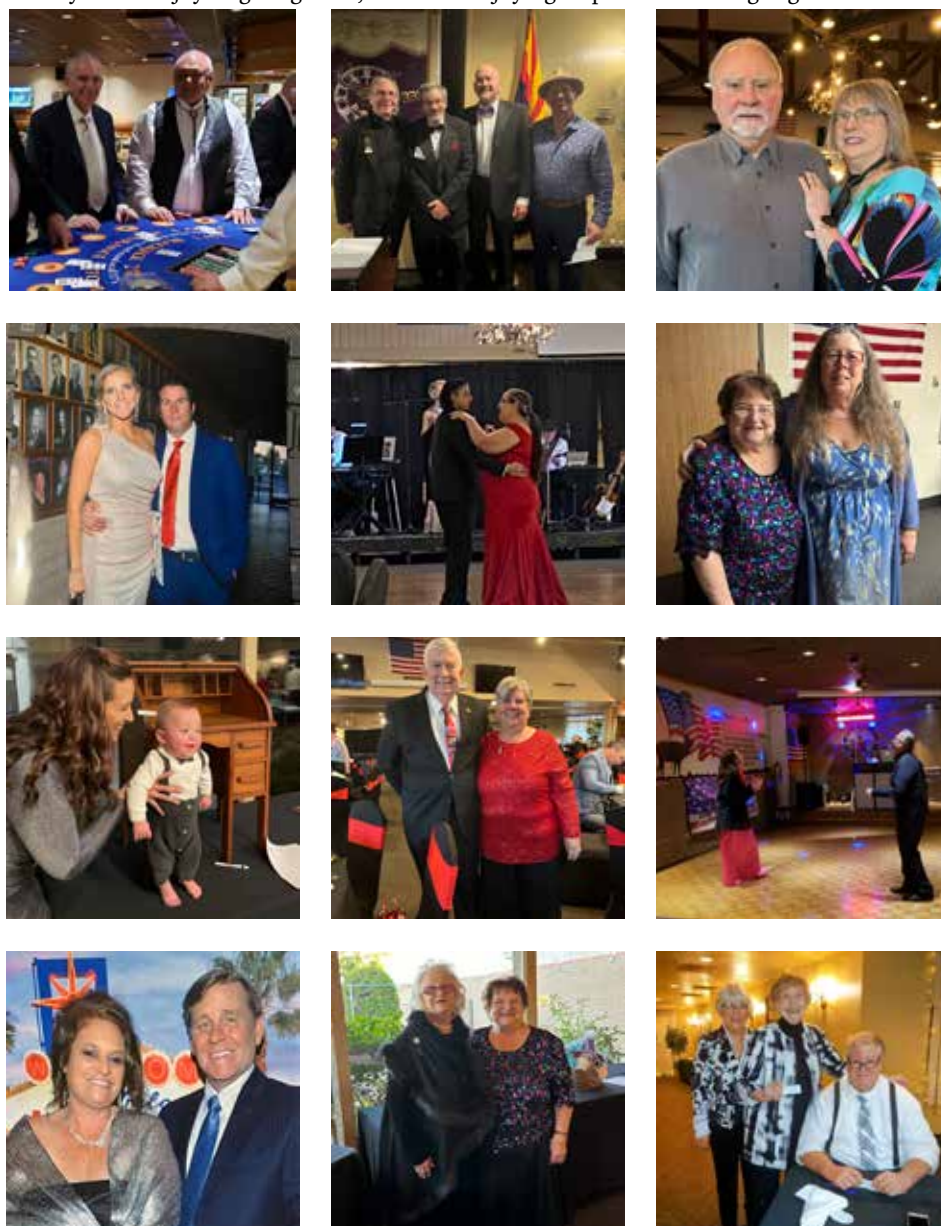
The Annual Charity Ball
