Meet Our Members

Lt Cmdr. James S. George's life story unfolds like a narrative of unwavering patriotism and selfless dedication. Born in the vibrant city of Chicago, Illinois, he felt the call to serve his nation from an early age, inspired by a family legacy of valor and sacrifice. His journey into the Navy commenced



in 1942, a pivotal moment that would shape his destiny.

From the bustling streets of Chicago to the sunkissed shores of Arizona, Lt Cmdr. George's path was one of relentless service and remarkable valor. In 2013, he made Arizona his home, purchasing a condo and embracing a new chapter of his life amidst the desert landscape. Their love bore fruit in the form of two children, a daughter named Amy and a son named Brendan. Amy resides in Wilmette, Illinois, while Brendan calls Palatine, Illinois, home. Their children, now grown, carry forward the legacy of service and sacrifice instilled by their father, embodying the principles of honor and duty in their own lives. In 2015, Lt Cmdr. George's journey intersected with the Elks Lodge, marking the beginning of a new chapter in his service to the community. Recognizing the shared values of patriotism and dedication, he became an integral part of the Lodge's mission, fostering camaraderie and support among its members. The partnership between the Elks Lodge and the Sea Cadets blossomed, as Lt Cmdr. George's leadership ensured the continued success and growth of both organizations.

As Lt Cmdr. George's journey continues, his legacy stands as a testament to the enduring values of honor, courage, and commitment. In every chapter of his storied career, he embodies the finest traditions of the Navy, the unwavering spirit of American patriotism, and the transformative power of family and community.

Of the nine participating agencies this year, the Maricopa County Sheriff's

Office (MCSO), Sergeant Anthony Menella presented a departmental award to Deputy Michael Bytnar of the Sheriff's Office. Officer Bytnar, a nine-year veteran of the MCSO, was instrumental in saving several lives while off-duty during a domestic dispute service call in 2023 with a knife-wielding suspect who had already claimed two lives. Later the same year, Officer Bytnar was respond-



ing to a house fire in Gila Bend, Arizona, when an unruly and violent crowd attacked the responding firefighters. Officer Bytnar's quick actions secured and calmed the area so that the firefighters could safely fight the fire.

As noted in the January 2024 Elks Tracks Edition article concerning the Public Safety Appreciation event, all of our awardees were submitted and reviewed by the Lodge's Public Safety Recognition Committee and the top recommended recipients were then provided to the Arizona State Elks Association for final consideration and selection of "Officer of the Year" to be presented at the May 2025 State Elks Convention in Tempe.

The 109th Annual Arizona State Convention was held from Thursday, May 9th through Saturday, May 11th, 2024, at the Tempe DoubleTree Hotel and Convention Center. Flag Day History

"In July of 1908, the Elks' Grand Lodge provided for the annual nationwide observance of Flag Day on the 14th of June each year, making it mandatory for each subordinate Lodge in the Order. June 14 was officially established as Flag Day by a proclamation by President Woodrow Wilson in 1916. Flag Day was not a national observance until 1949—President Harry Truman, himself an Elks member, was inspired through his Lodge in Independence Missouri, to sign an act of Congress that dedicated June 14 to the symbol of our country."

On the "Red Skelton Hour" on January 14, 1969, Red Skelton (1913-1997) shared a memorable story: "I had this one teacher, Mr. Lasswell, the principal of Harrison School in Vincennes, Indiana. To me, he was the greatest teacher, a true sage. During one Pledge of Allegiance recitation, he noticed our delivery had become monotonous. He asked if he could recite it, explaining the meaning of each word to us. 'I-me, an individual, a committee of one. Pledge-dedicate all my worldly goods to give without self-pity. Allegiance—my love and my devotion. To the Flag—our standard, Old Glory, a symbol of freedom. Wherever she waves, there is respect because your loyalty has given her a dignity that shouts freedom is everybody's job. Of the United—that means we have all come together. States—individual communities united into 48 great states, each with its own pride and dignity but united for a common cause, love of country. And to the Republic—a state in which sovereign power rests in representatives chosen by the people to govern, with government being from the people to the leaders, not the other way around. For Which it Stands—One Nation, so blessed by God. Indivisible—incapable of being divided. With Liberty—which is freedom, the right to live one's life without threats, fear, or any sort of retaliation. And Justice—the principle of dealing fairly with others. For All—meaning it's as much your country as it is mine.' Now, let's say it again..." His words remind us of our deep connection to the flag and our nation."

Ritual Runner Up: Yuma Lodge #476, with a score of 96.5641.


Ritual Champions: Phoenix Lodge #335, with a score of 97.2981.

The House Committee Corner



Hello Brothers and Sisters,

At a previous House Committee meeting, the subject arose regarding service animals allowed in the Lodge. Our Phoenix Elks Lodge #335 House Rules address this issue quite sufficiently, specifically HR-23: "No animals or pets shall be permitted within the facilities except when appearing upon the bills of special entertainment or required by the handicapped."

The House Committee conducted some research on this subject to clarify it for our members. The United States Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and Arizona Revised Statutes describe service animals as "dogs of any breed or size, trained to perform a task directly related to a person's disability." Service animals are not emotional support or comfort dogs, as providing emotional support or comfort is not a task related to a person's disability.

Our employees may ask for certain information using two questions:

Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability? What work or task has the dog been trained to perform? They are not allowed to request any documentation that the dog is registered, licensed, or certified as a service animal, require that the dog demonstrate its task, or inquire about the nature of the person's disability.

Of course, any member asked these questions regarding a service animal's status would answer honestly, thus not violating their oath of obligation. For any further information, visit www.ada.gov/topics/service-animals.

It has also come to our attention that there may be some misunderstanding by the membership about the duties and responsibilities of the House Committee. The duties of supervision and management of the club, social parlor, and facility shall always be subject to the control and direction of the Lodge, except for those actions and decisions pertaining to employee relationships and the fixing of prices for goods and services. Members may locate this and more information in the BPOE Statutes Annotated 2023 Section 16.040, Exalted Rulers-Lodge Officers-Committee Members Manual Page 8, and House Committee Handbook Page 2. The House Committee encourages all members to access elks.org for information and activities of our Order.

The House Committee will be as informative as possible to assist our members in the awareness of activities, procedures, and events affecting our Lodge.






