The Lodge 335 Veterans Committee is proud to announce our annual donations totaling \$18,000 to 10 outstanding organizations supporting our Veterans. Notable beneficiaries include:

- Honor Flight Arizona: Flies Veterans to Washington, D.C., at no cost to visit memorials dedicated to their service. Since inception, over 2,500 Veterans have benefited from three-day trips, including meals, hotels, and guided tours.
- Military Assistance Mission (MAM): Provides financial aid for rent, mortgage, car payments, utilities, and essentials like school supplies and Christmas toys, alleviating financial stress on military families.
- Women's Stand Down: Supports homeless and at-risk female Veterans with housing assistance, legal aid, job readiness, and health care, empowering them to lead stable, healthy lives.
- Motorcycle Relief Fund: Offers therapeutic motorcycle adventure tours for Veterans and first responders with PTSD, fostering camaraderie and support networks.
- Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Chapter 37: Empowers Veterans through services such as transportation to medical appointments, benefit claim assistance, and outreach programs.

Looking forward to seeing everyone this month! Thank you.

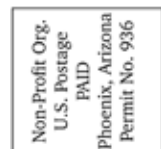

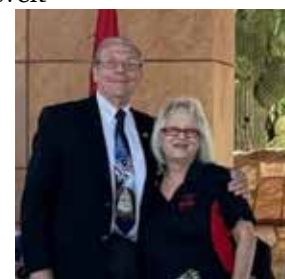
The True Meaning of Memorial Day

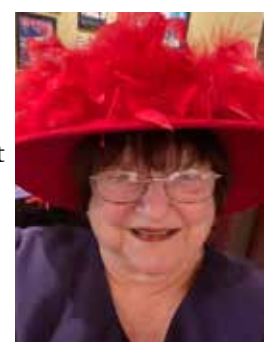

Sadly, Wayne passed away in 1995, leaving Janet to raise her children alone. Janet worked at the Municipal Court House in Bedford, Ohio, for 16 years as a Deputy Clerk. In 2004, her daughter Sandy moved to Arizona with her family. Janet followed them to Arizona, as she is doing again now that Sandy and Todd are moving to North Carolina.

Upon arriving in Arizona, Janet chose Surprise as her new home and worked in Glendale for Gateway Floral Company. She also volunteered at the stadiums in Surprise and Goodyear, enjoying Cleveland Indians games. Janet moved three more times, each time getting closer to the Phoenix Elks Lodge. Her last home has been her residence for 16 years with her rescue cat, Oreo, well-known from her Facebook pictures and stories.

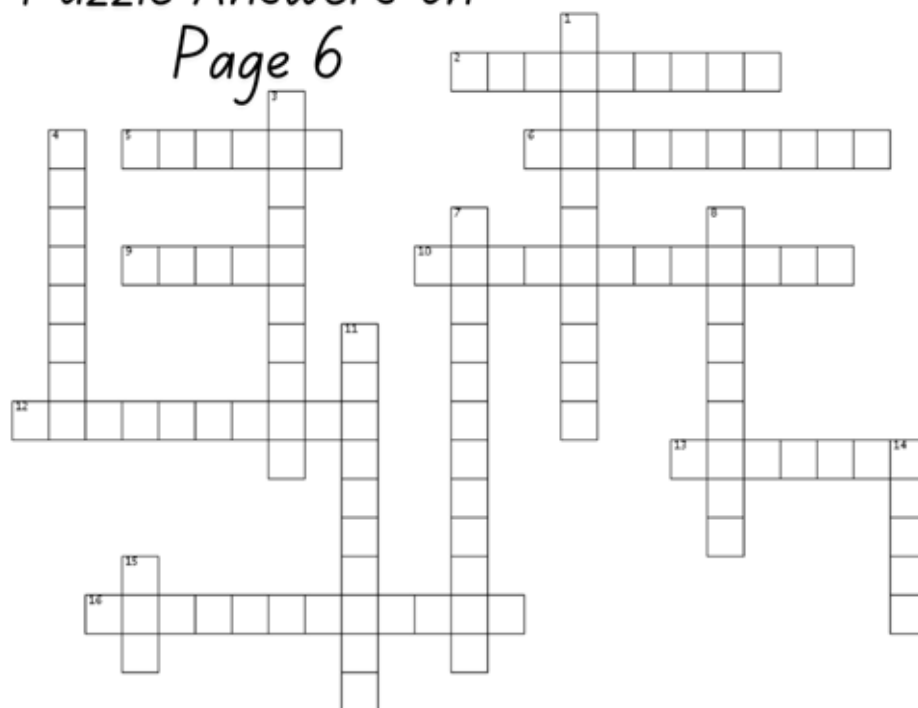

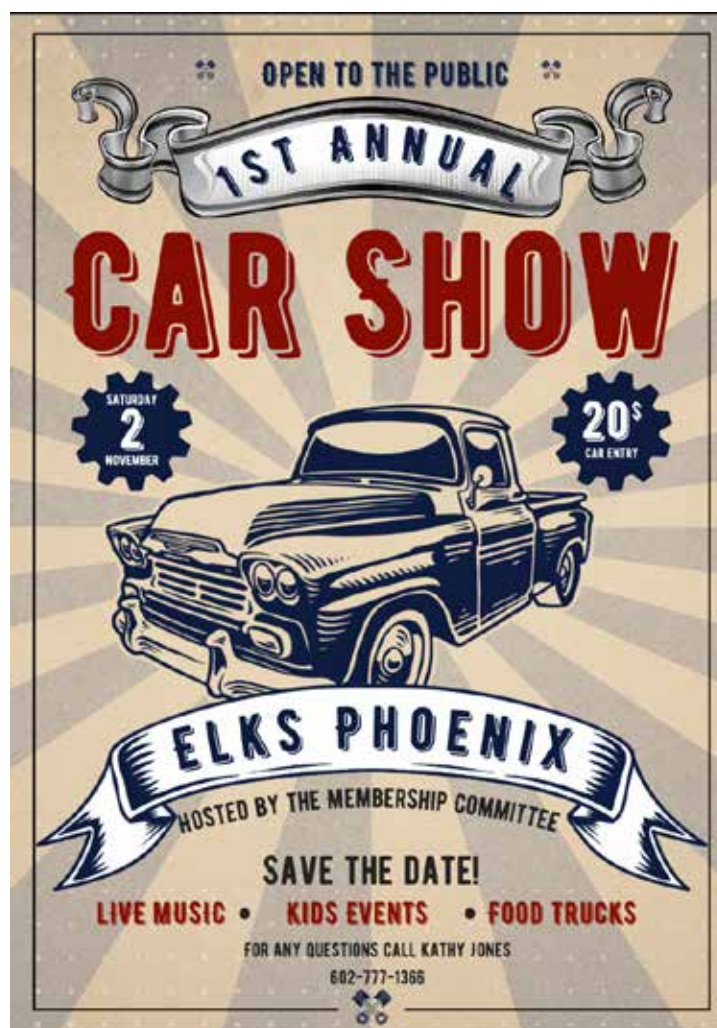
