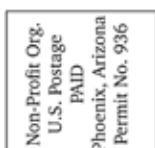

Red Cross Blood Drive

On Wednesday October 9th, Phoenix Elks Lodge #335 continued its tradition of community service by hosting a Red Cross Blood Drive.

With a pre-blood drive goal of collecting 16 units, the Red Cross was able to collect 30 units of blood.

Within this amount, 22 units were of Whole Blood products and 4 productive procedures of Power Red. A Power Red donation is a blood donation process that allows a donor to donate two units of red blood cells in one appointment. Power Red donations help more patients because red blood cells are the most commonly transfused blood component. Of the 30 donors, 8 were first timers.

Each unit of blood collected has the potential to save a life, making this event a testament to the impact a dedicated community can have.

I would like to thank Esteemed Loyal Knight Becky Simons and Thomas Schiavone for volunteering their afternoon to assist me in this very successful Blood Drive. 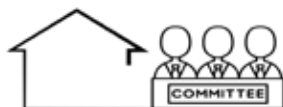

Hello Brothers and Sisters,
We would like to thank our members for the volunteer work that is done in the Lodge. This work encompasses a wide range of services, including assisting at

Bingo, providing and assembling baskets for our raffles, involvement in our youth groups such as the Scouts, Sea Cadets, and Antlers programs, food service to guests and members, as well as other areas where assistance is needed. Without the volunteerism of our members, our Lodge would not be as successful and productive as it is.

Regarding our food service, to comply with state food service safety laws, any member handling food must obtain and maintain food service certification. This can be done by going online and taking the food handler's safety course. The online course takes a few hours of your time and will certify you for three years. This course ensures that all people serving food comply with state regulations and provide a safe environment for food handling.

The following member ID numbers are out of compliance or will be by the end of next month and need to recertify by completing the recertification process online:
