Elks Hoop Shoot for 2024-2025

The Elks Hoop Shoot began in 1946 in Corvallis, Oregon, when Frank Hise, a Past National President of the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks, noticed that smaller kids had trouble keeping up with the bigger ones while playing basketball. Frank organized a free-throw contest so that every child could participate.

The program went national in 1972 when the first National Finals were held in Kansas City, MO, and has since grown to become one

of the largest youth athletic competitions in the country, with over 3 million kids participating annually. In 1975, the Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, MA, offered the program a space to display a plaque inscribed with the names of all National Champions, where it has been displayed ever since. Beginning in 2012, the Elks National Foundation (ENF) has managed this program and allocated more than \$1.5 million to fund the Hoop Shoot

Contests are held at the Lodge level, and winners advance to district, state, regional, and national contests. For Phoenix Lodge #335, the Lodge contest will be held on January 4th at Great Hearts Academy North Phoenix campus. The District contest will be in Wickenburg, AZ, on January 18th. The State tournament will take place in Apache Junction, followed by the Area 7 contest in Las Vegas, NV. The ENF covers the expenses of all participants at the Regional and National Finals contests.

The National Finals will be held in Chicago on April 24-25, 2025, at Wintrust Arena, home of the WNBA's Chicago Sky and the DePaul University Blue Demons. The contest will be livestreamed on the ENF's YouTube and Facebook pages.

The last time a contestant from Arizona won an age group was in 2013-2014, when Robert Burries from Pine Mountain Lodge #2809 won the 12-13 boys group by making 25 out of 25 shots.

The "grit" movement in education began a few years ago when psychologist Angela Duckworth studied people in various challenging situations, including National Spelling Bee participants, rookie teachers in tough neighborhoods, and West Point cadets. Her research suggested that grit was a more accurate predictor of success than social intelligence, good looks, physical health, or IQ. Grit is the will to persevere in the face of long odds. Importantly, this characteristic—so crucial for our children—is precisely what our Hoop Shoot program has developed and reinforced for more than 50 years.

Participants in the Hoop Shoot develop grit by setting goals, working hard to achieve them, failing, and bouncing back to try again, often working even harder the next year. In 2015, the ENF debuted a six-part series featuring videos of finalists and their parents sharing stories of hard work, determination, perseverance in response to failure, and the resilience to set goals, fall short, and get back up to try again. Through the Hoop Shoot, we have created a program that has become the Holy Grail of youth development.




