Great Elks with Great Hearts

If you ever visit the Lodge parking lot on weekday mornings between 7:30 a.m. and 8:00 a.m., you'll find the volunteers of the Great Hearts Liaison Committee hard at work. Their daily mission is to ensure the safety of the children whose parents are also Elks

Since the school became our Lodge's neighbor, the drop-off and pick-up process in the parking lot has been a challenge. Without volunteers monitoring the lot every day, non-members took advantage of our proximity to the school, creating unsafe conditions. Many children were nearly hit by cars, parents were entering through exits, and there was no organized system for parking or dropping off students.

This time of year, with our winter RV friends visiting from across the country, traffic becomes especially hectic. Over the years, many tried to find a solution, but it wasn't until last year that the Great Hearts Liaison Committee stepped in to make a difference.

These dedicated parents took it upon themselves to address the problem while also promoting the Elks' community and good deeds. With guidance from our Trustees, they purchased cones, established a system, and organized volunteers. Today, the parking lot is orderly and safe. Non-members are no longer permitted to use the lot, and our community of Elks-member parents continues to grow.

The committee also saw an opportunity to strengthen ties with the school and share the incredible work the Elks do—especially for children. They've been present at back-toschool events and various school functions throughout the year, spreading awareness of the Elks Lodge's mission and activities.

Thanks to these grassroots efforts, the committee has recruited over 100 new families from the school as dues-paying members of the Lodge. This infusion of younger families helps secure the future of our Lodge. As the committee grows, they're planning more social events for parents who are Elks members, including pool days, BBQs, and game

Next time you're in the lot and see the cones, take a moment to stop and say hello. The committee is always looking for parent volunteers to help with these efforts. They'd love to get to know you and share more about the work they do to keep our members and kids safe while fostering a strong relationship with the school.




