

Originally from the Windy City of Chicago, Kirby relocated to Arizona and dedicated 32 years to public service through the Arizona Department of Economic Security, managing special programs for employment services. In 1993, he married his beloved wife, Kathryn, and together they blended a beautiful family of four children.

Kirby's dedication to the Lodge is deep and unwavering. He has served on the House Committee and, most notably, has been the heart and soul of our Americanism Committee

for the past 16 years. With bittersweet emotion, Kirby has announced his retirement from this role. He remains committed to training the next in line to ensure this vital tradition continues with care.

During his time on the committee, Kirby has processed and supported an average of 150 students per year, recognizing their inspiring essays and patriotism. This year alone, 75 essays were received while 9 will accept awards. Sourcing entries from the Paradise Valley School District, charter schools, and parochial schools, Kirby has always encouraged students to speak with their parents and grandparents about patriotism, bringing generations together in reflection and pride. Kirby often says that “the readers get more out of the essays than they give,” a humble sentiment that captures the true heart of service. His love for country is deeply rooted in his family. His mother, a concert pianist, and his father, an interpretive writer, both instilled in him a deep appreciation for art, history, and expression. These influences led Kirby to volunteer at the Musical Instrument Museum (MIM), where his talents continue to shine.

Kirby's life motto is simple but powerful: “If you can do it, do it!” And do it he has, with grace, passion, and unwavering commitment.

The Maricopa County Stand Down event brings together over 75 service organizations to provide essential aid to veterans. This year, the event took place on March 13 and 14, 2025, at the Arizona State Fairgrounds, and we drew record crowds to our coffee carts and clothing and personal items.

For several years, our Veteran Committee has actively participated in this event. We:

- Operated two fully stocked coffee and snack carts, one stationary and one mobile, to serve veterans across all five service buildings.
- Distributed essential items such as clothing, undergarments, socks, non-perishable food, blankets, and toiletries.
- Collaborated with additional Elks Lodges and neighborhoods across Arizona to secure donated goods, including paper products and hygiene supplies.
- Partnered with organizations that provide critical services to veterans. These include Arizona Paralyzed Veterans, Ladies Stand Down, Community Bridges, Dress for Success, General Stand Down, U.S. Veterans, Veterans for Veterans, Resurrection Street Ministry, and Veterans Housing Coalition.
- Recognized that Stand Down itself offers a wide array of essential services, including dental, medical, legal aid, transportation, vision, and veterinary care.

The Phoenix Elks Lodge 335 is dedicated to making a lasting difference in the lives of our veterans. Through our involvement in Stand Down, we aim not only to provide immediate relief but also to contribute to long-term solutions for veteran homelessness and hardship.


