Flag Day Service Honors Our Nation & Those Who Serve

Phoenix Elks Lodge #335 proudly
continued the Elks tradition of honoring
our nation's Flag with our annual Flag
Day Service. As the first and only fraternal
organization to require a formal observance
of Flag Day each year, this ceremony
remains one of our most meaningful
patriotic traditions.

This year's service was especially
memorable, drawing the largest audience I
have seen since becoming an Elk in 2021.
It was inspiring to see so many members,
guests, veterans, families, and youth come
together to celebrate our nation's Flag and
the freedoms it represents.

We were honored to welcome Lt. Col.
Shayne "Shaka" Carroll, Commander of the
309th Fighter Squadron "Wild Ducks" at
Luke Air Force Base, as our featured orator.
Rather than simply delivering a speech, Lt.
Col. Carroll shared a heartfelt and personal
perspective on what the American Flag
means to him, why he proudly serves our
country every day, and the responsibility
that comes with defending the freedoms it
represents.

One of the highlights of his presentation
was the interaction with the audience,
especially the younger members of the Sea
Cadets. He asked them what the American
Flag meant to them, encouraging them to
reflect on the values of freedom, service,
sacrifice, and patriotism. Their thoughtful
responses reminded everyone in attendance
that the next generation understands the
importance of preserving the ideals our
Flag represents.

A heartfelt thank you to Lt. Col. Shayne
"Shaka" Carroll and his family for sharing
their time and inspiring message; to
the Sea Cadets and their commander
for helping set up the Lodge, proudly
carrying the historical flags throughout the
ceremony, and demonstrating exceptional
professionalism; to Clem Brown, PE.R., for
his outstanding narration of the History of
the Flag; to Joe Brown, PE.R., for providing
the music that brought the ceremony to
life; and to all of our Lodge officers and
volunteers whose dedication and teamwork
made this year's Flag Day Service a truly
memorable event. Most of all, thank you to
everyone who attended and helped make
this the largest Flag Day Service our Lodge
has enjoyed since I became an Elk in 2021.
Your presence demonstrated that patriotism
remains strong in our community as we
honored not only our nation's Flag, but also
the enduring principles of Charity, Justice,
Brotherly Love, and Fidelity.

Proposal for New Marquee Sign

The following was proposed in writing, read before the Lodge in regular session on July 16, 2026, and will be published in the August issue of the Lodge newsletter, the “Tracks” distributed July 31, 2026. Vote will be taken at Lodge in regular session on August 20, 2026.

The Marquee Sign Procurement Proposal has a projected cost in excess of the \$25,000 limit imposed by Grand Lodge Statute 16.050 (d). The Lodge Trustees managing this project are required to notify the Lodge Membership in writing that a motion will be made at the August 20, 2026 Lodge Meeting to approve funding for the referenced project.

Per Statute 16.050 (section k 1-6) the following are stated by the Board of Trustees:

- Purpose of the project - replacement of existing marquee sign.
- Amount to be expended for the purpose enumerated above - anticipated cost will not exceed \$85,000.
- Amount of indebtedness to be created - none.
- Any property to be mortgaged - none.
- Persons to be authorized to act for the Lodge - Lodge Trustees.
- Amount to be received by the Lodge - total cost will be covered by Committee fund raising, member donations and Lodge savings.

A motion will be made to put this Project funding to a vote by the Members attending the August 20, 2026 Lodge Meeting. Membership approval of the motion by a 2/3 majority will initiate a request to the Grand Lodge for approval. Upon final approval from the Grand Lodge the contracts may be signed by the Board of Trustees and work may commence.

Sign of the Times

The current “Marquee” sign in front of our Lodge has been in place since the Lodge was built in 1985. It is truly “rustic” in its appearance appearing as a relic from an earlier time, hearkening back before the use of cell phones. It was likely state of the art when it was first installed and has remained a constant fixture on 32nd Street with only its light bulbs being changed in 41 years. To be sure, the old sign is failing: the letters and plastic are brittle, it is time consuming to manually change the messaging by climbing high on a step ladder and challenging to fit a message there as the limit is 25 characters in 4 lines. The City of Phoenix will not allow our current sign to be updated and is essentially “grandfathered” in as is. My personal perception is that the current sign screams “ELKS ARE OLD”. As Exalted Ruler in April of 2022 I requested Members Rick Pojman and Jim Bowe to begin an investigation of what would be needed to replace the old sign with a modern electronic sign. Those performing the investigation contacted the City of Phoenix concerning necessary permits, their cost, requirements of where the sign can be placed on the property, what types of signs can be installed; requirements and costs for the necessary power supply and the approximate cost and construction from reputable local sign companies familiar with all requirements in our community. It should be noted that at no time during this investigatory phase that any actions were taken on behalf of the Lodge other than requesting information. This is important, as all contracts and legal permits are the responsibility of the Trustees, and of course, any motion for approval of a new sign would be made to the Members as well as any potential approval needed for funding from Grand Lodge.

This project has slowly but surely moved from its early stages and has taken some time to become a potential reality, however, four years later it appears we are at the threshold of being able to make this new sign a reality. The new sign will be digitally controlled and instantly be able to present to the public in clear, brightly colored beautiful detail what the Phoenix Elks are doing within our Lodge and in our community. I personally believe that a new sign will have an immediate and lasting benefit of increasing our membership through public interest as well as a new point of pride for our existing members. Please join me and our interested members in support of the approval for procurement and installation of our new Phoenix Elks #335 sign this fall! Shown below is the concept for the replacement sign alongside our current “lollipop” sign.

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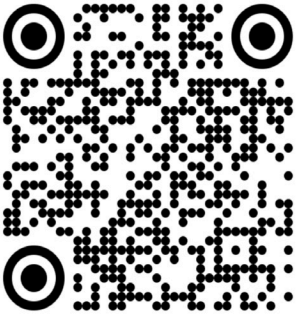


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
