Esteemed Leading Knight, Tyler Vanwey

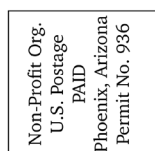

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS

The following By-Law was proposed in writing, read before the Lodge in regular session on August 20, 2026, and will be published in the September issue of the Lodge newsletter, the “Tracks” distributed on August 31, 2026. Vote will be taken at the Lodge in regular session on September 17, 2026.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BY-LAWS OF PHOENIX ELKS LODGE #335

I propose a By-Law Amendment for Phoenix Elks Lodge #335.

Pursuant to Grand Lodge, Article III, Sec. 18 of the Constitution, as Amended, and Sec. 13.200 Laws of the Order, the following By-Law change.
Article XV-A: AUXILIARIES AND ADJUNCT ORGANIZATIONS

Currently reads as:

Sec. 1 The Lodge does not recognize any Lodge Auxiliaries.

To read as follows:

Sec. 1. The Lodge shall have a motorcycle group auxiliary, known as the Phoenix Elks Riders. The Phoenix Elks Riders shall have the following duties, subject to the limitations imposed by the Constitution and Statutes of the Order:

- Only members and associate members may be members of the Phoenix Elks Riders.
- Only members of the Lodge in good standing may be Officers of the Phoenix Elks Riders.
- The Phoenix Elks Riders may charge its members annual dues.
- All funds generated by the Phoenix Elks Riders, excluding dues, belong to the Lodge, shall be promptly remitted to the Secretary and any use shall be properly

budgeted and approved by the Lodge.

e. The Elks Riders shall have their own By-Laws.

f. All members of the Phoenix Elks Riders shall execute and deliver to the Lodge a membership application which shall contain an agreement to indemnify and hold harmless the Lodge from loss, claim or liability arising from participation in activities associated with membership in the Phoenix Elks Riders.
