Homeless Youth Empowerment Program

PHOENIX, Ariz. — September 4, 2026 — The Phoenix Elks Lodge #335 Homeless Youth Empowerment Program continues its commitment to supporting young people experiencing homelessness throughout the Valley, donating more than \$1,700 worth of food, clothing and other essential items for distribution to youth in need. Through the Lodge's relationship with Homeless Youth Connection, items will be distributed directly to homeless



and vulnerable youth throughout the Valley, helping provide necessities while connecting young people with community support.

Approximately \$400 of the donated items were made possible through an Elks National Foundation Impact Grant, with another \$1,300 contributed by Phoenix Elks members and other community sources.

The Homeless Youth Empowerment Committee is continuing to build partnerships and identify opportunities to provide food, clothing and other necessities while supporting organizations working directly with homeless youth across the Valley.

CLC Veteran Outreach

In 2025, Phoenix Elks Lodge #335 was awarded a Focus Grant that enabled our Veterans Committee to provide a Bingo and Pizza Party at the Community Living Center (CLC), a short- and long-term care facility attached to the Phoenix VA Medical Center. Some residents are recovering from surgery, while others are unable to return home after their hospital stay. The CLC currently provides care for approximately 50 residents, and beginning September 1, 2026, the opening of the second floor will allow an additional 50 Veterans to receive care, comfort, and companionship.

A few members of our Veterans Committee visit the CLC every week, and our residents have come to look forward to those visits. We have brought puzzle books, sweets, handmade blankets, and handmade placemats for Veterans who eat their meals in their rooms. There is a special joy in getting to know these Veterans, seeing photographs from their military service, and listening to the personal stories they are willing to share with us. Our monthly Bingo and Pizza events have become especially meaningful. The Veterans enjoy the friendly competition, the prizes, the laughter, and, of course, the pizza! One of our residents is 105 years old, sharp as a tack, and still wins at Bingo quite often. Moments like these remind us that age does not diminish the need for friendship, laughter, and connection.

This program has also brought us the difficult reality of loss. When one of our beloved Veterans is transferred to Hospice and later passes away, our committee helps through Hospice and feels that loss deeply. These are not simply residents we visit; they become people we know, care about, and look forward to seeing.

Now in its second year, the Veterans Committee continues to provide Bingo, pizza, drinks, desserts, and prizes to the CLC each month. This has become a warm and meaningful tradition, and we have every intention of continuing it for years to come.

Our Adopt-a-Vet program is also growing. Currently, Phoenix Elks Lodge #335 volunteers visit Veterans at the CLC on Thursdays and Tuesdays, and we are training another Lodge member to add an additional day of service. Our goal is to eventually have a Phoenix Elks #335 shirt present at the CLC five days a week, bringing friendship, conversation, laughter, and a reminder to our Veterans that they have not been forgotten.

We are proud to serve those who have served our country. For our Veterans Committee, this is more than a program, it is a privilege, a responsibility, and a relationship that continues to grow with every visit.

A huge thank you to everyone who came out and supported our Sock Hop! Your generosity truly made the evening a wonderful success.

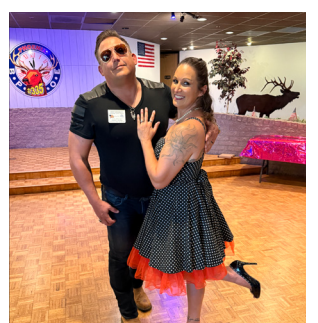

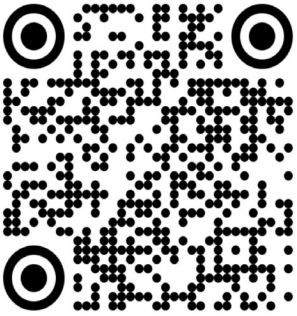
